Congratulations! Grand Marshals Bernie and Melissa Sargent



A native of Erie, PA and educated at California State University Fullerton California and a Veteran of the U.S. Army, Bernie has resided in El Paso for more than thirty-four years. He has been directly involved in many aspects of heritage, culture, having researched and written numerous articles on a multitude of subjects including districts, sites, people and events through-out West Texas and the Mexican Border State of Chihuahua, all the while running two businesses with his wife of forty years.

Bernie was a member of the El Paso County Historical Commission for seventeen years, serving as Chair for thirteen. He has been acknowledged for his work with awards presented by the Texas Historical Commission, the 2006 John B. Shepperd Leadership Award for Outstanding County Historical Commission Chairman for the State of Texas, the Excellence in Community Service presented by the Daughters of The American Revolution and the West Point Society of El Paso Volunteer Award. Additionally, he's received the Sun Bowl Volunteer of the Year Award for his dedication to the Annual Sun Bowl Parade, where he is one of more than four hundred committed individuals who work tirelessly to stage the annual Thanksgiving Day event that attracts nearly 300,000 viewers to El Paso. Additionally, he's received numerous other awards for his dedication to the preservation and promotion of EI Paso's and West Texas heritage serving on more than forty history related boards of directors during his time in El Paso.

Among the many projects, he authored a paper on the Camino Real in El Paso for Sul Ross University, assemblage of a team of architects and historians to compile a list of more than two hundred addresses located in the downtown El Paso area to preserve and protect vital historical assets in a portion of our community destined for much needed rehabilitation. Because of these efforts, a list of "carrots and sticks" have been developed by city officials to assist landowners to rehabilitate their properties, utilizing a myriad of tax credits and assistance's available for renovation. Additionally, I have published numerous papers and brochures all centering around the great heritage and culture of the Southwest.

Bernie co-founded the Keystone Heritage Park where a middle archaic village was discovered. He developed a plan to educate the community regarding the life of far west Texas dating back 4,500 years. He also developed the marketing plan and site design to incorporate a "parks within a park" concept. He was responsible for the grant writing efforts which to date have raised more than \$4 million (grants/donations/in-kind). In addition, he co-wrote an award-winning video, "Keystone Heritage Park" which helped to elevate the awareness of this site in the eyes of such groups as Smithsonian and National Geographic.

Recently he was contracted to research and develop a comprehensive study of the Downtown Historical District to include comprehensive information on the transformation


of the "District" between 1850 and 1915 to include pictures and listings of the business's as they progressed thru the many ownerships. The report morphed into a "pop-up" of photographs of the various establishments where they are available.



Additionally, he co-wrote many brochures and recently developed a walking tour of the historic El Paso saloons and theatrical establishments for the Visit El Paso convention team.

Bernie has been responsible for the creation of numerous sub-committees geared towards preserving and enhancing Texas history through video, TV, brochures, lectures and more.

In 2010 he was contracted to develop a market analysis, including an area assessment and competitive venue study with the intent to propose the Franklin Mountain Visitor's Center for Texas Parks and Wildlife. Additionally, his responsibilities included, reviewing existing studies to include the Franklin Mts. Interpretive Plan, the Franklin Mts. State Park Management Plan, market analysis, El Paso area broad demographics and trends (Ft. Bliss base expansion, etc.), populations currently served by the park (broad, from interviews with park staff), and visitor information for existing Museum of Archaeology & Border Patrol Museum.



Melissa was born in Lomita, CA, a suburb of Los Angeles and lived in 1000 Oaks, CA and many other beach communities. Finished school in Southern California at Cal State Fullerton with a Degee in Business Administration/Marketing

Would you have signed the Declaration of Independence?

- ★ Five signers were captured by the British as traitors, and tortured before they died.
- ★ Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned.
- ★ Two lost their sons serving in the Revolutionary Army; another had two sons captured.
- ★ Nine of the 56 fought and died from wounds or hardships of the Revolutionary War.

They signed and they pledged their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor.

What kind of men were they?

★ Twenty-four were lawyers and jurists.

★ Eleven were merchants, nine were farmers and large plantation owners; men of means, well educated, but they signed the Declaration of Independence knowing full well that the penalty would be death if they were captured.

★ Carter Braxton of Virginia, a wealthy planter and trader, saw his ships swept from the seas by the British Navy. He sold his home and properties to pay his debts, and died in rags.

★ Thomas McKeam was so hounded by the British that hewas forced to move his family almost constantly. He served in the Congress without pay, and his family was kept in hiding. His possessions were taken from him, and poverty was his reward.

★ Vandals or soldiers looted the properties of Dillery, Hall, Clymer, Walton, Gwinnett, Heyward, Ruttledge, and Middleton.

★ At the battle of Yorktown, Thomas Nelson, Jr., noted that the British General Cornwallis had taken over the Nelson home for his headquarters. He quietly urged General George Washington to open fire. The home was destroyed, and Nelson died bankrupt.

★ Francis Lewis had his home and properties destroyed. The enemy jailed his wife, and she died within a few months.

★ John Hart was driven from his wife's bedside as she was dying. Their 13 children fled for their lives. His fields and his gristmill were laid to waste. For more than a year he lived in forests and caves, returning home to find his wife dead and his children vanished.

So, take a few minutes while enjoying your 4th of July holiday and silently thank these patriots. It's not much to ask for the price they paid. Remember: freedom is never free!







Today, two counties report cases of wild poliovirus, Afghanistan and Pakistan.




